7 8 9 10	The Carroll ISD School Safety and Security Committee meeting was called to order at approximately 4:06 p.m. at the Carroll ISD Administration Center, 2400 N. Carroll Avenue, Southlake, Texas, by Asst. Superintendent for Board & Community Relations, Julie Thannum.
11 12 13	Item 1. WELCOME NEW MEMBERS
14 15 16	Committee members introduced themselves and CISD Superintendent, Dr. Lane Ledbetter, welcomed everyone. The committee's charge, membership, and meeting norms were briefly reviewed.
17	Item 2. COVID-19 UPDATE
18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25	The COVID-19 update included information about the district's COVID-19 Dashboard, changes to the CDC international travel guidelines (effective Jan. 26, 2021), CISD's current guidelines regarding large-group gatherings and indoor/outdoor facility rentals, a COVID-19 vaccine update, and other messaging/reminders. Carroll ISD follows all Tarrant County Health Department guidelines. Large-group gatherings and indoor/outdoor facility rentals are currently prohibited through March 1 st after which time CISD administration will re-evaluate the situation. Not included in large-group gatherings are student competitions such as athletic and academic events.
26 27 28	CISD employees will be encouraged to get one of the COVID-19 vaccines as they become available to them, but employees will not be required to get a COVID-19 vaccination.
29 30 31	Choice of Instruction Enrollment Update: in-person v. Dragon Virtual Academy (DVA)
32 33 34	Elementary (Pk-4), Intermediate (5-6) and Middle Schools (7-8) are currently at 72-77% for in-person instruction and 23-28% for virtual instruction (DVA). The high school campuses (9-12) are at 53% in-person and 47% DVA.
35 36	Item 3. PRESENTATION: 2019-20 DRUG & ALCOHOL SURVEY RESULTS
37 38 39 40 41 42 43	CISD Curriculum Coordinator, Melanie Ringman, reviewed the 2019-20 Drug and Alcohol Survey results. The Texas School Survey of Drug & Alcohol Use, which is administered by Texas A&M University, is an anonymous and voluntary survey for a limited number of selected CISD campuses. The CISD campuses that participated in the 2019-20 survey were Dawson Middle School, Carroll High School and Carroll Senior High School.
44	Item 4. UPDATE: NEW DRUG & ALCOHOL CURRICULUM
45 46 47 48 49	A meeting will be held on January 22, 2021 with the Curriculum & Instruction staff and CISD SRO's to discuss a new drug and alcohol curriculum. The health curriculum currently begins for students in the 8 th grade, however, students in younger grades participate in "Red Ribbon Week" and the School Resource Officers also talk with students.

OVERVIEW: 2017 BOND – SAFETY PROJECTS 2 3 An overview of the 2017 Bond projects included the following: 4 5 Armed School Resource Officers (15 SROs located throughout the district) 6 Security Vestibules/Layers 7 Fencing/Playground Safety 8 ICC 500 Storm/Tornado Shelters at CISD campuses (6 campuses) 9 Surveillance Cameras and Key Cards Raptor Visitor Sign-in Procedures 10 11 Volunteer Background Checks Drills, AEDs and Safety Signage 12 13 Large-Scale Active Shooter Training 14 Bullet Resistant/Intrusion Glass 15 Reduced Entry Points at CHS and CSHS 16 17 Item 6. OVERVIEW: NEW "STOPit" MOBILE APP 18 19 CISD Coordinator of Counselors, Tammy Pulse, gave an overview of the new mobile app program for 20 all students called "STOPit" (the Dragon Tip Line was previously used). "STOPit" provides a way for 21 the district to respond to students who report instances of self-harm, vaping and/or other substance 22 abuse, bullying, suicide prevention, etc. The service provides 24-hour monitoring to the district. 23 24 **Item 7. SAFETY AUDIT FOLLOW-UP:** 25 AUDIO/VIDEO PROJECT – KITCHEN/LOADING DOCK AREAS 26 27 The updated five Standard Safety Protocols were reviewed as follows: 28 **HOLD** (hold in place – in your classroom or area, clear the halls) 29 **SECURE** (lockout – get inside, lock all outside doors) 30 LOCKDOWN (Lock doors and do not open until given the all clear, turn out lights, get out of sight) 31 **EVACUATE** (evacuate to an announced location) 32 **SHELTER** (hazard and safety strategies: tornadoes, earthquakes, Hazmat situations) 33 34 The Fall 2020 Safety Audit Report addressed recommendations related to better secure the fronts of 35 building (bollards and barriers) and the back areas and back doors of CISD buildings. 36 37 CISD Director of Child Nutrition Services discussed how the Child Nutrition department addressed the 38 issues identified in the Audit. Additional safety training has been provided to employees and the district 39 is also providing Child Nutrition and Maintenance employees with a video/audio method of 40 communication with persons who request entry at the back door kitchen areas and loading docks. 41
